Dear Gentlemen:

Following up on my earlier letter, I am enclosing copies of two Affidavits from former Ramelli drivers who clearly state that they were instructed not to take recyclables to the recycling center. Instead, they were instructed to bring the recyclables to Ramelli's yard where they were mixed with municipal solid waste, reloaded in to garbage trucks and brought to the River Birch Landfill. All the while Ramelli charged Kenner as if it was actually recycling the material.

As noted before, the purpose of the recycling program was to divert recyclable material from the waste stream, thereby reducing the amount of waste deposited in the River Birch landfill. This reduction of waste would save Kenner money because of the reduced tipping fees at the landfill. As a result of the deliberate actions Ramelli, Kenner did not get the benefit of the reduced tipping fees while paying for the recycling program.

As the City acquires more evidence, I will naturally forward that information to you as we receive it, but I wanted to advise you of the allegations that have been uncovered so far.
